In Case of an **Emergency**

- Don't panic. Call for help!
- Has the person collapsed or stopped breathing?
 - Call 9-1-1 or your local emergency number right away.
- Swallowed the wrong medicine or too much medicine?

Inhaled poison?

Get to fresh air right away.

- Poison on the skin?
 - Take off any clothing that the poison touched.
 - ▶ Rinse skin with running water for 15 to 20 minutes.

- Poison in the eyes?
 - Rinse eyes with running water for 15 to 20 minutes.
 - ▶ Call Poison Control, 1-800-222-1222.

What is a Poison?

A poison is any substance that can harm your body. Anything can be a poison if it is taken in the wrong amount, in the wrong way, or by the wrong person. Most poisonings happen in the home and are <u>preventable</u>.

Poisonings Span a Lifetime

Children are NOT the only ones at risk. Anyone at any age can be poisoned, including pets.

Poisons Found In and Around Your Home

- Medicines (prescription and over-the-counter)
- Household Cleaning Products
- Alcohol
- Bug and Weed Killers
- Car Maintenance Products
- Carbon Monoxide (CO) gas
- Cigarettes/Cigars/Vaping Products
- Wild Mushroom/Berries
- Plants (Poison Ivy, Oak, Sumac)



SAFETY TIPS



- Save the Poison Control number, 1-800-222-1222, in your phone and post it in your home.
- Store medicines and cleaning products in locked cabinets/pantries/closets/lock boxes.
- Keep all products in their original containers with the labels on them.
- Use a medicine spoon/cup/oral syringe to give or take liquid medicine.
- Store food products away from cleaning chemicals and medicines.
- Child-resistant does NOT mean childproof.
 Re-seal and lock up harmful items after every use.
- Keep button batteries, small magnets, vaping products, and liquid laundry packets away from children and pets.
- Install a carbon monoxide (CO) detector on every floor, and outside sleeping areas.
- Be sure to check and change CO and smoke detector batteries when you "change the time" (daylight savings time).

Poisons can hurt you if:

- Swallowed
- Breathed in
- Splashed/sprayed on skin or in eyes
